In certain circumstances if you do not provide us with the information we require for our due diligence checks or onboarding procedures, we may not be able to enter into a contract with you. Right to access (sometimes known as a data subject access request or a

for these goods or services. Customers - any person or organisation that purchases tobacco leaf and/or products from us.

Trade Associations - a group organised and funded by business/society Landlords - the owner of land or buildings used by us. At BAT, we need some information about you and your organisation, such as your name, job title, organisation registration numbers, bank details, tax details and contact details so we can work with you to manage the contract and relationship for the goods or services you supply to us, or we supply to you. We may collect your personal data via a Third-Party risk assessment tool to complete due diligence

and risk management processes necessary for Third Party onboarding. As part of managing the business relationship, we may be legally required to conduct 'know your customer' (e.g. via 'World Check One') or similar compliance screenings on you or your organisation. In doing so we will use the information listed below. We obtain this information either obtain directly from you or from your employer, or the company you are shareholder or director of.
